To do smocking, start by making a grid on a piece of fabric using small, evenly-spaced dots. Then, thread a needle and make a small stitch under the first dot, from one side of the dot to the other. Then, bring the stitch to the next dot and repeat.

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### **Guide To Cushion Smocking**

You need atleast 3 times the cloth for the width of the final piece. ie if you want a final smocked piece of 10 inches you need to take 30 inches cloth to do the smocking. But then it also depends on the tightness of the smocking stitches. If you make very slack stitches the cloth needed will be less.

One smocking stitch is used to make a small sample which is applied to fabric and edged with lace and ribbon. A zip is not required as it has a pillow case opening on the back of the cushion.

This smocking is done on gingham, striped, or a gridded fabric. Basically 5/8" stripped fabric is made into squares and a honeycomb or vandyke stitch is used to bring the sections together. Finished fabric will have the illusion of a solid fabric.No pleating is used for this type of smocking.

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The process for smocking is based on a grid formation that is usually marked first on the fabric with small dots. These are then joined together with a loose running stitch and pulled to create tubes of regular gathers in the fabric.

### **Smocking Techniques at Miu Miu - The Cutting Class**

This smocking pattern doesn't involve any special skill, just hand sewing and lots of time and patience. And I didn't invent it, in fact there are other tutorials on the internet that you can find. I started with a size XL men's t-shirt. First, you mark out a grid of dots, these are where you will place your stitches.
